Dear Black & Pink Family,

We hope this letter finds you well. We are reaching out with both urgency and enthusiasm to request your support for an initiative that is both crucial and timely—one that directly impacts the lives of countless LGBTQ individuals, particularly transgender individuals and incarcerated. At the forefront of a rapidly changing and hostile landscape lies a community that needs our help.

For over 20 years, Black and Pink has been at the vanguard of fighting for justice, safety, and dignity for LGBTQ people who have encountered the criminal justice system. In this critical moment, Black and Pink needs your support more than ever.

Why is Our Work Important?

Black and Pink's work remains urgent as we are witnessing a sharp backlash against the rights and freedoms of the very communities we serve. In the wake of troubling policies, such as the recent executive orders denying the existence of transgender and nonbinary identities, mandating transgender women be housed in men's prisons, and removing workplace protections, we are called to act. These regressive measures threaten to undo hard-won protections against workplace discrimination and secure living conditions for transgender individuals, while undoubtedly exacerbating the suffering of LGBTQ people already marginalized by the criminal justice system.



Currently, LGBTQ individuals, particularly transgender and gendernonconforming individuals, are disproportionately impacted by the criminal justice system. According to the National LGBTQ Task Force, LGBTQ individuals are incarcerated at rates up to 3-4 times higher than their heterosexual counterparts. In addition, transgender women are at an even higher risk for adverse experiences due to incarceration as they are more likely to face harassment, violence, and denial of medical care in correctional facilities (LGBTI Justice Project, 2022). These figures underscore the urgent need for Black and Pink's transformative work that provides a lifeline for individuals seeking to break cycles of trauma and incarceration.

Our Successes

Over the past 20 years, Black and Pink has made extraordinary strides in advancing the rights of incarcerated LGBTQ people. Our Inside Member Newsletter, with over 20,000 subscribers, ensures incarcerated individuals receive crucial resources and a sense of community. We offer quarterly newsletters to keep our members informed and connected to supportive services as they navigate reentry into society. In addition, Lyndon House, which opened in 2020, has provided shelter and stability to 12 individuals thus far, creating a safe space to heal and rebuild. Finally, Black and Pink is proud to announce this year, we will launch our Opportunity Campus—an innovative, long-term housing solution for formerly incarcerated LGBTQ individuals.

Hope's call to action will motivate all to continue the revolution for justice, equality, and acceptance, reinforcing the need for solidarity in driving lasting change for the LGBTQ+ community.

Black & Pink National is a prison abolitionist organization dedicated to abolishing the criminal punishment system and liberating LGBTQIA2S+ people and people living with HIV/AIDS who are affected by that system through advocacy, support, and organizing. Founded in 2005, Black & Pink has grown into a national network with over 20,000 current and formerly incarcerated LGBTQIA2S+ and people living with HIV/AIDS members across the country.

Our programs, such as the Lydon House, Opportunity Campus, the Pinkprint Project, Sex Worker Liberation Project, We Know Cohort, and our nationally distributed newsletter, have provided critical support and resources to those most affected by systemic oppression. These initiatives have not only offered immediate assistance but have also laid the groundwork for long-term systemic change. Envisioning Enhanced Impact: Six Goals for the Next 5 years 1. Establish additional Opportunity Campuses in key regions to provide safe and affirming housing for LGBTQIA2S+ individuals reentering society.

2. Develop comprehensive reentry programs tailored to the unique needs of LGBTQIA2S+ individuals, focusing on employment, education, and healthcare access.

3. Double the distribution of our prisoner-written newspaper to ensure more incarcerated individuals receive affirming and empowering content.

4. Expand the Marsha P. Johnson Youth Leadership Institute to cultivate the next generation of advocates and leaders within the LGBTQIA2S+ community.

5. Foster Community Engagement: Host annual events and workshops to build solidarity, share resources, and celebrate the resilience of our community members.

6. Develop diverse funding streams to ensure the longevity and stability of our programs and services.
